

Refugee and IDP Data—2015

At the end of 2015, **65.3 million** people had been forcibly displaced from their homes:

40.8 million internally displaced people + **21.3 million** refugees + **3.2 million** asylum seekers = **1 out of 113** people worldwide

There are more displaced people today than at any time since World War II.

- 95% of Syrian refugees live in Syria's neighboring countries
